Welcome to the second edition of **The Whau Creek Whisper** – the official newsletter for the club. The season is now well underway and what a great start it has been. We have seen almost 20% growth in membership from last year and now almost 70 teams take the field each weekend representing the mighty Burbs. Both the junior and senior club have seen significant growth (we are now the biggest senior club in NZ with 28 teams) but perhaps most pleasing has been the growth in girls cricket (see story below).

As you can imagine there is lots happening so read on for some of the highlights and also a snapshot of what is coming up.

Girls just want to have fun

The 2019/20 season sees Suburbs New Lynn cricket Club fielding five girls/ladies' teams which is a great achievement as the most we have had in the last twenty years is two! This season we are fielding a Year 3&4 team, an Under 11 soft ball team, an Under 13 team, an Under 16 team and a premier reserve ladies' team. For the first time ever we have decent pathway for female cricketers at Suburbs.

Part of the reason for this growth is that every Thursday sees the SNLCC Girls Club in action. All our teams meet for training which sees our younger and more senior players join for some fun, games and training.

This has only been made possible through some great support from Auckland Cricket with its 'Social Sixes' programme. Also great credit goes to Joanne, Trevor and Swatna for the hard work they put into starting this Girls Club.





Club Spirit and Values - the Suburbs Way

To help launch the season we held two special evenings at the club. At the Senior Launch on Tuesday 22 October over 50 captains and players gathered to preview the season, hear from Doug Cowie from Auckland Cricket and to discuss the way we want to play as a club. And then on Monday 4 November we had a Junior Club parents and coaches evening where we introduced the Good Sports philosophy for junior cricket.

In addition to these two evenings we have also held two practical sessions for our junior coaches where we offer tips and advice about the best way to coach junior cricket.

The combined effect of these events is that over 100 key club members have had a chance to discuss and consider how we want to play our cricket as a club which has to be a good thing.

Umpires make a difference

Auckland Cricket has really focused on umpire development for the last few years and it is making a difference with far more games getting official umpires these days. Suburbs has also played a part of with several of our members becoming official umpires, including our Junior Club Chair Brendon Muir and Arshad Mohammed from the Black Riders team. Congratulations to Arshad who recently received his Level 3 Umpiring Certificate.
